

Safety and Reunification Procedures

1. Every year NCSA holds multiple practice drills to work out optimal responses to emergencies, including fire and intruders so that adults and students are prepared for whatever may come.
2. Every teacher has been provided with a safety backpack and a classroom binder that provides a specific response and instructions for every expected emergency that could arise and they have also received training in those responses.
3. NCSA is the only elementary school in the county where adults have gone through Community Emergency Response Training (CERT). This includes coverage of disaster preparedness, fire safety and suppression, medical triage and first aid and light search and rescue.
4. Should off-campus reunification need to take place, it will happen at ***Twin Cities Church at 11726 Rough & Ready Highway in Grass Valley***. Durham Transportation, the same bus company that operates throughout the county, will transport students there. In order to pick up children the parent or designated person will have to be named on the Emergency Card and have a picture ID.
5. In the event of an emergency, your best source for accurate information will be the same kinds of notifications you already receive from the school. It will be via phone, text and email. Listen all the way to the end of the message to get full details. If something isn't stated, it's because it's unknown. **If your contact details change, make sure the school is updated.**
6. In the event of an emergency, DO NOT COME TO THE SCHOOL unless requested. Go directly to the reunification site and await further instructions.
